

## **ACT Reading Section Tips**

## 1. Correct answers are camouflaged.

 Look for answer choices that paraphrase what the author wrote—say the exact same thing with different words.

## 2. Incorrect answers are distracters.

- <u>Distortions:</u> take words directly from the passage, but make a statement that does not reflect the content of the passage.
- The switch: takes a true statement and flips it around.
- Extremes: make an overly strong statement (using words like "completely," "always," etc.) that is not always true.
- <u>"Nice" choices:</u> make a statement that is easy to agree with, but doesn't reflect the content of the passage.

## 3. There are four steps to answering the questions for an ACT reading passage.

- **1.** Find the critical words and phrases.
- **2.** Scan the passage for critical words, and underline them
- **3.** Either skim and scribble (faster), or read the passage, paying more attention to the parts where you underlined the critical words (slower).
- **4.** Answer each question by referring to the parts of the passage where you underlined the critical words for that question.
  - i. Spend no more than 30 seconds on each question.
  - ii. Remember to eliminate distracters.
  - iii. For questions that don't point to a specific part of the passage, figure out where to look in the passage by reading the answer choices.
